VETERINARIAN: Champ du Perier Equine Clinic

Inspection upon arrival

As part of health safety procedures at the EQUITA LYON exhibition, free and mandatory clinical examinations are systematically conducted on the arrival of the equines at the Eurexpo site.

Horses must be in a good overall condition and each of the elements listed below must also be presented.

If the clinical examination is debatable, the animal/horse may be placed in quarantine stables that are situated outside the exhibition, and in more severe cases, the horse will be refused admission to the exhibition.

All of the extra examinations and tests are at the animal/horse owner's expense and have to be paid on site.

Veterinarians and the Organising Committee reserve the right to exclude any horse which does not meet these conditions.

Mandatory elements

For all horses

- **The identification papers with the description** noted by an official veterinarian or a studbook agent or provisional certificate for those waiting for the definitive description of the studbook.
- **An electronic transponder.**
- **Type 2 certificate*** for the means of transport of horses for transports longer than 8 hours.
- **Certificate of competence*** for the person driving the horses (CAPTAV for France).

* In case of a visit from the Direction Départementale de la Protection des Populations du Rhône (DDPP), these documents may be requested.

Horses in France

- **A health certificate** from the licensed veterinarian of the departure farm stating that the horses or equine species being exhibited have been free for at least 30 days from clinical signs of any Category 1 infectious disease (Equine Infectious Anemia, West Nile Disease, African horse sickness). It must include the order number of the veterinarian, the address of the horses' usual place of residence, the name and SIRE number or transponder of the horse(s) concerned by the certificate.

Horses from foreign countries

- A copy of the pedigree and zootechnical certificate issued by the country of origin and endorsed by the authorities (**see Article D653-111 of the French Rural Code**):
 - ⇒ **Intra EEC:** Certificate from the TRACE NT system

 - ⇒ **Outside the EEC GRAND EXPORT:** comply with the legislation and regulation of the country of origin in correlation with the French systems: vaccination, transport documents, sanitary protocol (possible obligation of quarantine), customs protocol (ATA carnet or temporary admission).

HEALTH CONDITIONS**VETERINARIAN: Champ du Perier Equine Clinic****Vaccination****For equines over 1 years of age**

Equine flu vaccination is mandatory: the "vaccination" sheet should include a stamp from veterinarian who is not the owner of the animal.

1. For all horses whose primary vaccination was administered before 1st January 2013:

- a) Primary vaccination comprising two injections of flu vaccine separated by an interval between 21 and 92 days;
- b) For boosters, the interval between two injections must not exceed twelve months.

2. For all horses whose primary vaccination was administrated after 1st January 2013:

- a) Primary vaccination comprising two injections of flu vaccine separated by an interval between 21 and 92 days;
- b) Booster to be administered 5 months later: the interval between two injections must not exceed 6 months;
- c) **For the annual booster, the interval between two injections must not exceed twelve months.**

In any case, the last injection must be done at least 7 days before you come to the exhibition.

For equines under 1 years of age

Equine flu vaccination is mandatory: the "vaccination" sheet should include a stamp from veterinarian who is not the owner of the animal.

A primary vaccination comprising two injections of flu vaccine separated by an interval between 21 and 92 days.

In any case, the last injection must be done at least 7 days before you come to the exhibition.

Equine Viral Rhinopneumonitis vaccination is recommended.

Unweaned foals

- Description, birth certificate or the covering certificate of the mare.
- **A mandatory electronic transponder.**

If any of the elements described are presented and are not correctly completed and up-to-date the horse will be refused admission to the exhibition.

Veterinary service

There will be a continuous veterinarian service during the opening hours of Equita' Lyon.

Emergencies will be ensured 24/24.

Any intervention will be at your expense.

As veterinary teams are at the disposal of all the horses present at the exhibition, please be aware that a veterinarian might not be immediately at your disposal on your arrival.
